"The kiwiberry sector is going through a significant growth phase, and production is projected to rise from 140,000 export trays in 2016 to 200,000 trays in 2017, so we must do all we can to understand and manage our biggest biosecurity risk and the impacts they could have on our industry," says Geoff.

The kiwiberry sector comprises of about 40 ptoducing, or soon to be producing, hectares – most of this is based in the Bay of Plenty region. Last year NZKBG generated \$4.2m in revenue, with 90 per cent coming from exports.

NZKGB will be represented by Kiwifruit Vine Health, which became the first industry group to sign the GIA deed for biosecurity readiness and response in May 2014.

KVH's chief executive Barry O'Neil says his organisation is pleased to represent the kiwiberry industry at the decision-making table. "We have a commonality of biosecurity issues. Kiwiberry are likely to be susceptible to many of the same pests and diseases as other kiwifruit cultivars, so working together in partnership makes sense."

"We're currently working to determine what pests and identify what readiness activities are required to mirtigate the risk of these threats."



GIA secretariat manager Steve Rich welcomes NZKBG on behalf of the GIA partnership, saying the new addition further strengthens efforts to better deliver biosecurity outcomes. "It's great to see sectors facing similar risks and concerns joining forces for the purposes of delivering better biosecurity."
